In 2023, our annual arts grants provided over \$1,000,000 in funding to 94 applicants.

Application dates

Applications open: 1 May 2023

Applications close: 5pm, 13 June 2023

Notification to applicants: October 2023

Aboriginal artists please note: Applications for Aboriginal Arts Project grants will open on 21 August 2023 for activities taking place in 2024.

Are you eligible?

The applications are open to artists or small to medium arts organisation who plan to develop or present work in 2024.

You can only apply to one of the grant categories, for either an arts project or an arts residency.

Not all types of projects are eligible for funding. Contact the [City of Melbourne Arts Grants](#) team to find out if your project is eligible for funding.

You cannot apply if you have an unfinished acquittal or unpaid debts to the City of Melbourne.

Make sure your outcome or outside work is based in the City of Melbourne [Council boundaries⁵](#)

Note: There are extra eligibility requirements for applicants with online outcomes or for a creative development only or for your specific grant category.

Grant categories

The following grants are available for activities taking place in 2024.

Arts projects

Arts project grants are open to artists and small to medium arts organisations.

You can apply for:

- up to \$20,000 for the creation and presentation of projects that are shared with the public or
- up to \$5,000 for a creative development with no public outcome needed.

Arts residency: Boyd Studio-1

This residency is open to artists and small to medium arts organisations.

Successful applicants will receive \$10,000 plus studio space in-kind.

There will be two six-month residencies:

- 12 January to 30 June 2024
- 4 July to 15 December 2024

Writing residency: Boyd Garret

The Garret writing residency is open to writers of any genre.

The successful applicant will receive \$10,000 plus studio space in-kind.

There will be one 12-month residency from 12 January to 15 December 2024.

Note: The Garret studio space is at the top of the building. The only way to access the studio is via a steep staircase.

Writing residency: Libraries

The Writing residency is open to writers of any genre.

Successful applicants will receive \$5,000 plus studio space in-kind.

There will be two three-month residency during 2024 (dates to be negotiated).

Arts residency: Art and Heritage Collection

This residency is open to individual artists.

The successful applicant will receive \$10,000 plus access to the Art and Heritage Collection at the Melbourne Town Hall.

There will be one residency of up to 12 months during 2024 (dates to be negotiated).

How to apply

1. Read the guidelines thoroughly
2. Watch the grants briefing presentation and the applicant top tips video on the website
3. Preview the application form
4. Contact the arts grants team with any queries
5. Allow ample time to plan, research, gather support material and to draft your application.
6. Apply via SmartyGrants online application form (log in or create an account)
7. Complete and submit your online application by 5pm 13 June. Late applications will not be accepted.

Accessibility

We aim to make the arts grants accessible to all people.

Applicants should do their best to make their project accessible.

Access support is available for Deaf and Disabled people when applying.

Deaf and Disabled artists can apply for an extra \$2,000 to cover access costs.
