This book is written by the City of Melbourne.

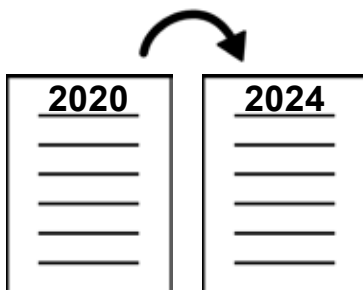


This book is about our **Disability Access and Inclusion Plan**.

Our plan

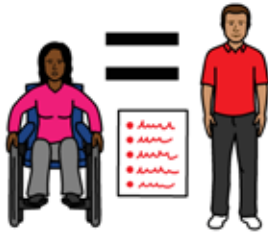
- is from 2020 to 2024

- work with different groups and government to make our city more accessible

- have inclusive services, programs and events



- follow access laws



- teach people about access and inclusion

- help community groups with access and inclusion projects

- work with our **disability advisory committee**.



Our disability advisory committee is a group of people with disability who tell us their ideas.

- told us what they thought about our draft plan.

We listened to ideas from people in our community.

For example

- people with disability and their families

- access experts



- **advocates.**

Advocates help people with disability to choose what they want.

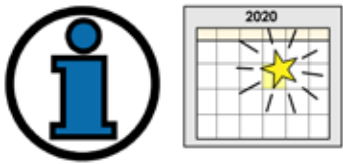

1. Everyone has good access around Melbourne.

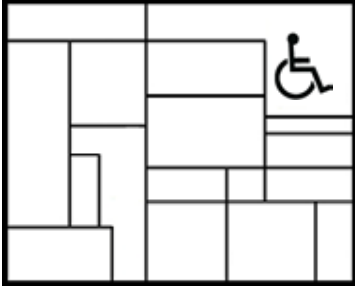


2. Everyone can access our information, services and events.

Goal 1 - Everyone has good access around Melbourne



We will

- make sure access is part of our building plans
- show people how to make our city more accessible



- make boats accessible and safe
- have more **Changing Places** around the city.



Changing Places are toilets for people with disability who need support.

Goal 2 - Everyone can access our information, services and events



We will

- write plans to make our services and events more accessible



- listen to ideas from people with disability including children and young people

- update information about access on our website



- have different types of information, for example

- Easy English



- Auslan



- other languages



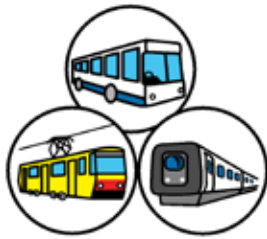
- communication boards.

Goal 3 - Everyone in our community is treated with respect
