- Short term berthing is available at all marinas at Docklands. Waterfront City offers the largest number of public berths for short term berthing at Docklands.
- Longer leasing arrangements can be made at Marina YE, d'Albora Marina Victoria Harbour and New Quay Marina.

## Clean boaties



- All Docklands marinas comply with the requirements of the Marina Industries Association of Australia's Clean Marina Program.
- Docklands is a 'no discharge zone' – the use of vessel toilets, sinks and showers that discharge through the hull is prohibited.
- The discharge of polluted effluent from manual and automatic bilge pumps is prohibited.
- Pump out facilities are provided at a number of places around Docklands; refer to Waterfront City Marina map.

## Look for the green



It's easy to find the public visitor berths at Melbourne Docklands, thanks to the unique colour coding used in all four marinas. Green caps on the marina piles signify public berths, white caps are for private berths and orange caps are for commercial berths – so just look for the green caps. Bookings are essential.
