#### 1. Commencement of meeting and apologies

The meeting commenced at 5.30pm.

The Chair, Lord Mayor Sally Capp, advised that the meeting was being streamed live and a recording will be made available on the City of Melbourne website before close of business Wednesday 3 May 2023.

#### **Library at The Dock Makerspace**

Jo Bacon expressed appreciation for the City of Melbourne providing the Library at The Dock Makerspace to the community. Jo asked if Council will consider increasing the funding to the Makerspace facility to expand the opening hours and increase the number of trained staff so there are more opportunities for connection through creativity in the community.

Cr Hakim, Creative Melbourne Portfolio Lead thanked Jo for the question and advised that the Makerspace showcases the breadth of activities and resources available at libraries at the City of Melbourne, including the Munro Library Makerspace which will be launching in November. Cr Hakim further advised that Makerspaces contain specialist equipment and are run by a dedicated team, however Council does train library customer service staff to support the Makerspace. Cr Hakim noted the current review of the Libraries Framework which will be made available soon that will consider the potential of increasing library opening hours.

#### Respecting Navy, Army and Air Force personnel

Chris Thrum asked Council's thoughts on the speech given by Collingwood Football Club Captain Darcy Moore after the ANZAC Day football match which outlined respect for ANZACs and the importance of respecting all Defence Force personnel. Chris also asked where we would be without Defence Force personnel.

The Lord Mayor thanked Chris for the question and noted that Councillors were impressed with the speech which recognised those who have fallen, those currently serving and those personnel who have now left the Defence Force. The Lord Mayor further noted that Council supports the ANZAC Day March; sends representatives to the Dawn Service parade and wreath laying; and supports the activities of the Defence Force to the extent that Council has a role to play.

#### **Docklands Representative Group / community grants**

Sandra Severin asked a number of questions relating to the Docklands Representative Group (DRG), citing the difficulties with being able to join and the lack of information about DRG in the community and online. Sandra also asked about the grants received by DRG from the City of Melbourne.

Cr Hakim, Health, Wellbeing and Belonging Deputy Portfolio Lead thanked Sandra for the question and advised that the DRG received two Connected Communities Impact Grants in 2022 and 2023 for the Docklands Owners Corporation Network initiative, noting that the first year of the grant was used to pilot the running of workshops and information sessions for owners corporations and the second and final year of funding is focused on embedding and sharing more broadly across other parts of the city that have high rise communities.

Cr Hakim further advised that for Connected Communities Grants, Council requires reporting and acquittals, and recipients receive 70 per cent of the applied funding upfront and 30 per cent upon submission of progress reports. Cr Hakim stated that officers will contact Sandra directly to discuss the difficulty in joining the DRG and to provide further information on operational support grants.

At this point in the meeting the time for consideration of questions expired and resumed at the end of the meeting.

#### 6.1 Hawke Street Linear Park concept design

The purpose of this report was to seek endorsement of the final concept design for the Hawke Street Linear Park project under Major Initiative 46: Transport and Amenity Program, which is co-funded by Council and the Department of Transport and Planning.

#### 6.2 Parliamentary Inquiry into the 2022 Flood Event

The purpose of this report was to seek endorsement of the City of Melbourne submission to the Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry into the 2022 Flood Event.

- 1. That the Future Melbourne Committee:
  - 1.1. Endorses the City of Melbourne submission to the Parliamentary Inquiry into the 2022 Flood Event (refer Attachment 2 of the report from management) subject to the following changes:
    - 1.1.1 On page 13 of the City of Melbourne submission, delete the following paragraph:

A recently completed raised road section (bund) in Hobsons Road close to the riverbanks has prevented flood water overtopping this section of the road. This bund was constructed by the developer of adjacent land as part of development works. This was a Melbourne Water requirement forming part of the relevant planning permit. This bund performed as intended and prevented river water from flooding Hobsons Road. A bund is proposed by Melbourne Water on Kensington Road, east of the Kensington Road pump station, which may further reduce river water flooding on Hobsons Road; however, Hobsons Road is also affected by flooding from the local catchment.


and replace it with the following paragraphs:

A recently completed raised road section (bund) in Hobsons Road close to the riverbanks has prevented flood water overtopping this section of the road. This bund was constructed by the developer of adjacent land (71 Hobsons Road) as part of development works. It was a planning permit requirement by Melbourne Water for the developer to provide a safe pedestrian access / eagres across Hobsons Road during a flood event (flood events up to 1 per cent AEP) to the existing flood free pathway within the Riverside Park. This bund performed as intended and provided a safe access on to the flood free pathway in the Riverside Park during this flood event. It also prevented flood water from the river overtopping the bund as overland flow. The underground storm water drains connecting Hobsons Road to the river do not have any non-return valves. This caused storm

water back flow through the drains into the inland section of the Hobsons Road bund contributing to localised flooding. In addition to that, flood water from the local catchment in Hobson Road contributed to the flooding in Hobsons Road due to reliance of gravity drains and the high water level in the river.

Construction of this bund is a part of the wider flood management strategy proposed by Melbourne Water for Hobsons Road and Kensington Road. There is another similar road bund and a new Pump Station/drain and some levee banks along the river proposed to be constructed in Kensington Road as part of the Melbourne West Waterfront development works. As per the Melbourne Water flood management strategy, implementation of the full flood management strategy will reduce flooding in Hobsons Road and Kensington Road.

- 1.1.3 Add the following text to the end of the final recommendation in Part 10: ".and the role of racecourse land in floodwater retardation"

#### **Facilities for Dogs in Open Space**

Helen Burdett submitted a written question asking if the provision of facilities for dogs such as dog waste bag stations and bins can be considered around heavy traffic areas such as New Quay, Victoria Harbour and Yarra's Edge. Helen also asked if Council can consider implementing shared dog/human drinking fountain combinations in areas that are not currently within designated dog parks.

Cr Leppert, Environment Portfolio Lead advised that Council's current practice is to provide dog waste bag dispensers and dog water bowls in designated dog off-leash areas in parks, and this approach was supported by the community through the recent engagement regarding new off-leash areas.

Cr Leppert further advised that providing waste bag dispenser bins and dog drinking bowls along New Quay, Victoria Harbour and Yarra's Edge promenade would be a new approach to the provision of these facilities within the City of Melbourne and would require expenditure for new assets and ongoing costs to service. Cr Leppert noted that if there is consistent demand for these facilities outside the existing off-leash areas, Council will consider providing these facilities in the future.

Cr Leppert extended an invitation to Helen to continue the conversation further.

Cr Le Liu left the meeting at 6.36pm, and returned at 6.38pm.

#### **ATET Docklands**

Aleysha Thyssen submitted a written question asking what City of Melbourne is actively doing to support residents in relation to the ongoing ATET issue in Docklands. Aleysha stated that the answers supplied to the questions raised at the community information session on 14 March were not sufficient, and noted that the noise coming from ATET has become worse since the community meeting.

Gene Servadei submitted a written question noting that neighbours have left Docklands due to noise generated from ATET. Gene also asked if this is what Council meant by planning application TP-2021-620 as "having met the vision for Docklands"?

The Deputy Lord Mayor, City Planning Portfolio Lead expressed frustration with the ongoing situation with ATET in Docklands, noting that what is occurring there is unacceptable and it should not continue. The Deputy Lord Mayor noted that Council has heard the concerns of residents and has not stopped in the background since the information session in working to address the issues raised.

It was noted that the City of Melbourne operates in a legal framework of planning permits and business licences, and that Council officers in conjunction with the EPA, Liquor Control Victoria and Victoria Police are continuing to explore options with the venue operator to reduce noise from the venue.

Further there remain ongoing investigations by Council under the Health and Wellbeing provisions and a separate investigation by the Environment Protection Authority. These investigations have progressed including extensive testing and analysis of data which is very close to completion. Council will provide further updates in the very near future.

#### 10. Closure of meeting

The Lord Mayor declared the meeting closed at 6.41pm.
