Participation at Preventive Health Conference, Darwin, April - May 2024

Purpose and background

- 1. The purpose of this report is to seek Committee approval for Councillor Dr Olivia Ball to travel to Darwin to attend the Preventive Health Conference 2024 between 30 April and 2 May 2024.
- 2. Convened by the Public Health Association of Australia (PHAA), the Preventive Health Conference is an annual Conference aimed at providing a platform to engage, challenge and exchange ideas, where pivotal issues for building prevention in Australia are discussed and where delegates can learn from the experience, opinions and perspectives of sector leaders and their peers.
- 3. City of Melbourne (CoM) is a member of the PHAA, the peak body for leading conversation in public health policy across Australia.

Key issues

- 4. Local government is a target audience for the Conference which will feature 16 presentations from researchers, practitioners and policy makers involved with the Australian Prevention Partnership Centre through research, collaboration or as a member of one of the funding partners.
- 5. The theme for the 2024 Conference is 'Building prevention success stories'. The topics to be covered include vaping and smoking cessation; community co-led design; nutrition and physical activity; preventing the health impacts of climate change and celebrating past prevention success.
- 6. As the Portfolio Lead of Health, Wellbeing and Belonging, Councillor Dr Ball's participation is considered beneficial as many of the important public health topics for Melbourne's community are being discussed at the Conference. The themes and issues align with a number of key strategies, initiatives and programs, namely:
 - 6.1. Delivery of the Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan which establishes the overall aims and priorities to improve and promote the public health and wellbeing of people in the municipality.
 - 6.2. Delivery of policies and programs to improve the public health of Melbourne's community. These include addressing food insecurity through a Community Food Relief Plan and Food Policy; tobacco control, smoking and e-cigarette use through the Smoke-free Melbourne Policy; the creation of smoke free areas in Melbourne and providing cool spaces during hot weather to prevent heat stroke.
 - 6.3. Programs supporting mental health and minimisation of harm from alcohol, drugs and gambling.
 - 6.4. Supported short-term accommodation solutions through the Make Room project.
 - 6.5. Services and programs for families, youth and children.
 - 6.6. Climate change, resilience and public health.
- 7. The estimated cost of Councillor Dr Ball's participation is \$3,650.

Recommendation

8. That the Future Melbourne Committee approves participation by Councillor Dr Olivia Ball in the Preventive Health Conference in Darwin between 30 April and 2 May 2024 at an estimated cost to Council of \$3,650.
