Potential Parking Meters at Eastwood and Bellair Street, Kensington

Leo McCartin asked a question relating to the potential parking meters at Eastwood and Bellair Street in Kensington. The Lord Mayor, City Transport, Infrastructure and Operations Portfolio Lead, thanked Leo for his participation in the consultation and advised that parking reviews are done every 12 months. Currently, there is no consideration of metered parking on the train side of Bellair and Eastwood Street.

Family and Domestic Violence Support

Aaron Moon asked a question relating to the type of family and domestic violence support provided by the City of Melbourne.

Cr Dr Ball, Health, Wellbeing and Belonging Portfolio Lead, advised that the City of Melbourne provides a range of support to people who are experiencing or at risk of domestic violence, including eight access points to Family and Children Services staff support, legal support from Justice Connect, a Women's Safety and Empowerment Action Plan, healthy masculinity community workshops and harm prevention program (i.e. Club Respect) for sporting clubs. There are also gendered base violence and gender equality training programs for Council staff.
