MELBOURNE INTERNATIONAL STRATEGY 2005/6 – OUTCOMES REPORT

Division Marketing, Tourism & Major Events

Purpose

1. To provide an outcomes report on the implementation of the Melbourne International Strategy for 2005-06.

Recommendation

2. That the Business and International Relations Committee receive the report of the outcomes of the Melbourne International Strategy 2005/6.

Key Issues

- 3. The outcomes of the Melbourne International Strategy 2005-06 are described in Attachment 1.
- 4. The Melbourne International Strategy delivered significant outcomes for Melbourne in 2005/6. Highlights included:
 - 4.1. successful development and delivery of a range of initiatives to support the 25th anniversary of the Melbourne Tianjin sister city relationship including the Lord Mayor mission to Tianjin, September 2005; Melbourne Children's Garden in Tianjin; Tianjin Government leader training and work placement program, ongoing program of high level civic interactions with visiting Tianjin delegations in Melbourne;
 - 4.2. consolidation and ongoing growth of business and civic profile of the Melbourne Office Tianjin in both Melbourne/Victoria and Tianjin;
 - 4.3. successful delivery of the inaugural China In-country Professional Development Program April 2006 with 12 fee paying participants;
 - 4.4. increased community involvement in sister city events such as Tianjin Dancing Kite Festival (January 2006), Opening of Piazza Italia (January 2006) and Osaka Twilight Festival (February 2006);
 - 4.5. the delivery of successful Games City program as part of the 2006 Melbourne Commonwealth Games including extensive civic hosting program for national and international stakeholders, Games city welcome ceremonies for representatives from participating nations;

- 4.6. significant progress towards the formation of a strategic alliance between the City of Melbourne and the National Capital Territory of Delhi as a legacy of the 2006 Melbourne Commonwealth Games;
- 4.7. launch of the Melbourne Boston Medical Research Fellowship joint Council/Melbourne Boston Sister City Association Inc in partnership with Royal Melbourne Hospital and Partners HealthCare (Boston) project with Dr Sharon Van Doormun undertaking the inaugural fellowship in Boston;
- 4.8. ongoing development of Melbourne Milan sister city activities including the presentation of Parading Milan in Melbourne as part of Motorola Melbourne Spring Fashion Week, 2005 and development of *Melbourne a Milano* program for February 2007; and
- 4.9. 344 events/activities were coordinated by Council during 2005/6, to support Melbourne's Capital City role and contribute achieving the Council's vision of international recognition for the opportunities it offers all Victorians to live, learn work and prosper.

Time Frame

5. The Melbourne International Strategy outcome report covers 2005/6.

Relation to Council Policy

- 6. The objective under Strategic Direction 1.3 in *City Plan 2010* is to strengthen and develop long term strategic partnerships with sister cities, Business Partner Cities and other key partners.
- 7. The Melbourne International Strategy identifies the following themes:
 - 7.1. opening doors to business;
 - 7.2. encouraging excellence through education;
 - 7.3. attracting international visitors;
 - 7.4. welcoming visitors and special guests;
 - 7.5. levelling the playing field through sport and arts;
 - 7.6. empowering young people; and
 - 7.7. supporting communities.

Consultation

8. Implementation of the Melbourne International Strategy involves close consultation and working relationships across many areas of the Council. Regular working and strategy meetings are held between Melbourne International and Business Melbourne to ensure the effective implementation of the program. Many elements of the program were delivered with existing and new partners with community, government, business, educational and civic organisations, both in Melbourne and internationally.

Government Relations

- 9. The Council works in close partnership with the Commonwealth and Victorian Governments as well as other local governments in the development and delivery of Melbourne International Strategy.
- 10. Excellent working relationships have been established with Council counterparts in each of the sister cities and key international partner organisations.

Finance

11. Operating expenditure of \$1,256,721 was incurred in 2005/06 for Melbourne International Relations. Slightly offset by revenue of \$58,318.

Legal

12. No direct legal issues arise from the recommendation in the report.

Sustainability

- 13. The Melbourne International Strategy and key projects undertaken through the strategy have a strong likelihood of short and long term positive outcomes. Environmental concerns are an increasing priority in countries such as China and the 25th anniversary activities with Tianjin were used as an opportunity to promote Melbourne's credentials in environmental management practices and building techniques and technologies eg CH2.
- 14. The strong educational theme of the Melbourne International Strategy also provides opportunities to continue to incorporate environmental themes, for example into the Melbourne Osaka Yacht Race, as well as offering young people experiences that will enhance their personal and professional growth.

Background

15. The former Business and Marketing Committee approved the Melbourne International Strategy 2005-06 at its meeting on 10 May 2005. A half year status report was presented to the Business and Marketing Committee in February 2006.

MELBOURNE INTERNATIONAL STRATEGY 2005/6 – OUTCOMES REPORT

No direct legal issues arise from the recommendations of this report.

Section 3C(1) of the *Local Government Act* 1989 ("the Act") provides that:

"The primary objective of a Council is to endeavour to achieve the best outcomes for the local community having regard to the long term and cumulative effects of decisions."

Section 3C(2) of the Act provides that in seeking to achieve its primary objective the Council must have regard to facilitating objectives including:

"(d) to promote appropriate business and employment opportunities;"

Section 7 of the City of Melbourne Act 2001 provides additional objectives including:

"(a) to ensure a proper balance within its community between economic, social, environmental and cultural considerations within the context of the City of Melbourne's unique capital city responsibilities;"

Section 3D(2) of the Act states that the role of a Council includes:

- "(b) *providing leadership by establishing strategic objectives and monitoring their achievement;*" and
- "(d) *advocating the interests of the local community to other communities and governments.*"

The subject-matter of the report is within the objectives, role and functions of Council.
