Funding Support Requests November 2019

Purpose and background

- 1. The purpose of this report is to seek direction from Council as to whether recent requests for funding should be funded from the discretionary fund.
- 2. In July 2013, the Future Melbourne Committee considered the process for funding items of a discretionary nature and resolved that, from 31 July 2013, only the following items would be considered:
 - 2.1. Those items that are received with a lead time of greater than 90 days to the date of the event (except for table sponsorships).
 - 2.2. Those items ineligible for funding from existing programs.
- 3. The recent request for funding (refer Attachment 2) is outside the normal Event Partnership Program, Business Events, Community Grants and Art Grants funding cycle. In summary, this is:
 - 3.1. A request from Corpus Medicorum for financial support to provide six student scholarships to participate in the China tour in May 2020 (\$23,400).

Recommendation from management

5. That Council approves a contribution of \$5000 to Corpus Medicorum, as well as in-kind support (logo and official messages of support for sister city related activities with key stakeholders in China).

Outline of Funding / Support Requests

1. Request from Corpus Medicorum for financial support to provide six student scholarships to participate in the China tour in May 2020 (\$23,400)

Council has received a request from Corpus Medicorum to provide funding support for six student scholarships (valued \$3900) to enable medical students who are living, studying or working in the City of Melbourne.

These scholarships enable medical student musicians to participate in their China tour (May 2020). The tour will feature performances in Tianjin, Beijing and Shanghai and anticipates in addition to musical performances, some meetings and site visits with medical representatives.

Council has assisted in the three previous overseas tours undertaken by Corpus Medicorum to our sister cities of St Petersburg, Osaka, Milan and Thessaloniki.

Financial and civic support for student participation in the Corpus Medicorum tour, will demonstrate Council's support for community led activities which support Melbourne's sister city partnerships. This aligns with the Creative City and International Engagement goals of Council Plan 2017-2020.

Management Recommendation

Management is supportive of Council's support of the tour through in-kind support (logo and official messages of support for sister city related activities) with key stakeholders in China and a contribution of \$5000.
