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














Activities



You will need

- Recycled cardboard from cereal boxes, biscuits, etc...
- Feathers
- Straws
- Any other materials you may have lying around your home
- Scissors
- Stapler
- String
- Hole puncher

Instructions:

- Cut down the cardboard to the shape of a bird
- Use the left over cardboard pieces for the wings and beak
- Use the feathers and other things to decorate your bird
- Use a hole puncher to make a hole
- Thread a piece of string through the hole
- Your cardBIRD is now ready to be hung around the house or play with outside

SUBMARINE WINDOW

You will need

- Transparent contact paper (sticky paper)
- Coloured paper for frame and cut outs
- Cellophane paper
- Tissue paper
- Masking tape
- Scissors

Instructions

- Cut the coloured paper into the shape of a cirle (submarine window)
- Stick your window frame onto the transparent contact paper (sticky paper)
- Decorate your widow by using the cellophane, tissue and card paper to build your image (imagine what you can see through a window of a submarine)
- When you are finished decorating, stick another piece of the contact paper over your window
- Cut out your window following your circle frame

SUNCATCHER

Another activity you can do with the same materials is a large suncatcher!

Instructions

- Hang a big piece of contact paper on a window using some masking tape, with the sticky part facing out
- Add cellophane and tissue paper to the sticky surface
- Add any other materials you can find (just remember that light will travel best through transparent materials)
