The event features cultural activities and public forums open to all members of public which are aimed at enhancing the experiences of all.
Marco Polo Project Marco Polo Project - strengthening the Melbourne community	\$1,495	Marco Polo Project is an online and off line community of language and cross-cultural peer- learners. This project proposes to run a series of translation evenings and China-Australia literary salons to strengthen our core community in Melbourne. These offline activities will bring together Mandarin speaking international students, advanced learners of Mandarin and Melbourne based writers and readers.

St. Mary's Coptic Orthodox Church, Social Support Program One day out , a visit to the Trout Farm, Melbourne	\$800	The grant will fund one day outing for all members, as a recreation activity for clients who are isolated and cannot access activities. The project aims to encourage members to develop independence and social skills to enhance quality of life and empower members, encourage them to access other related activities.
Romp and Stomp organising committee Romp and Stomp 2014	\$3,000	Romp & Stomp celebrates International Children's Day, as part of the national-wide Children's Week celebrations. It is the 12th year of the event which highlights the value of early childhood education. It is an event especially for children aged 0 to 5 years old and their families and has a focus on improving the education, health and safety of children and families.

Inner Melbourne Life Activities Club Purchase of computer for IMLAC use	\$1,000	Presently all club records are maintained on members' personal computers. Purchase of a computer is required to consolidate records and provide for updates. The member newsletter is an important communication for the club and this will be prepared using the computer. The computer will be used for site visits to new members.
Collective of Self Help Groups (COSHG) 'CD in the CBD' - (Exploring Community Development in the Heart of Melbourne)	\$2,860	The aim is to bring together those with experience of Community Development to explore the values and benefits this model offers to groups, communities, individuals and organisations. This forum will share and enhance existing knowledge, experience and skills. The information gained will be made available to non-participants via the newsletter, website and retained within library collection for students and research purposes.
Harm Reduction Victoria Inc. StreetWize	\$3,000	DanceWize is a program of Harm Reduction at dance events. At these events, volunteers disseminate health and sexual health resources, and harm reduction information. DanceWize was approached to provide this service around the night clubs on King Street to combat the unsafe use of GHB identified in the area. We want to do a pilot of this project between Jan-March 2014.
The Royal Women's Hospital (RWH) Foundation My Yoga Baby (pilot program)	\$7,200	My Yoga Baby is a prenatal yoga group for young pregnant women. This is a pilot program of an innovative approach to working with marginalised women at the RWH. Evidence informs us prenatal yoga empowers and strengthens social, physical and mental health of women. There is no yoga offered in maternity hospitals within Melbourne. Youlden Parkville Cricket Club (YPCC) Supporting Life-Long Engagement in Cricket	\$5,000	YPCC supports the development of our members as future leaders and aims to increase participation in sport as part of a healthy lifestyle. We want to expand an outreach program with local schools to conduct cricket programs in their PE classes, offer coaching accreditation to senior and teenage junior players, in addition to parents who are important volunteers and engage a highly accredited coach to oversee both the outreach and coaching development part of this project.
Lentara UnitingCare Asylum Seeker Men's Groups	\$7,500	The asylum seeker men's group assists in reducing the social isolation of men seeking asylum in Melbourne. It gives them the opportunity to come together and develop social and support networks and engage in various activities.
Community Food Marketplace trading as Melbourne Farmers Markets Carlton Farmers Market @ Carlton Primary School	\$8,700	Provide a fresh food community marketplace in the grounds of the Carlton Primary School on the first Saturday of the month, commencing in May 2014. The 'Carlton Farmers Market' will bring together Carlton's' diverse communities and promote healthy food choices and improve access to fresh produce. The market provides opportunities for volunteer participation and ongoing fundraising for small groups and local agencies.
6th Melbourne Scouts The Camp Kitchen Project	\$7,600	The rear section of the scout hall is over 115 years old. It houses a kitchen, group meeting and store room areas. The kitchen area is in need of modernisation and the addition of amenities including: hot and cold running water, hygienic food preparation and cooking facilities and a separate 'craft' sink area where members can enjoy a full and varied program of activities. We believe that improved facilities will create new opportunities leading to increased membership and positive outcomes for the wider community.
Bent TV Inc Gender "X"	\$4,116	People who don't subscribe to the traditional gender binaries of male and female suffer from discrimination and alienation from mainstream society. The project encourages students to attend university and empowers students to seize opportunities available to them.
Football Club Birrarung FCB Coaching Curriculum Program: Coach, Mentor and Volunteer skill development	\$5,000	This project will engage football development specialists to implement a club wide Coaching Curriculum for the creation of: long term member benefits for our junior soccer club; player skills and game ready programs; coaching excellence; training programs to educate coaches, mentors and volunteers; training tools to implement the Coaching Curriculum across all age groups; equipment to train and play games, and engagement with all members of the club community.

Workshops will also share and discuss diet, sleep and general health issues in relation to grief and loss. A publication about health and wellbeing during bereavement will also be published.
Crime Stoppers Victoria A safer Melbourne for international students and multicultural communities by making it easy to report crime	\$5,000	Crime Stoppers Victoria is looking to create a series of video / audio files in the top 10 languages in the CoM. Providing multiple language touch points will help communities confidentially report crime. The video/audio messages will be placed on our website, smart phone applications and will be provided to multicultural media outlets across Melbourne.
Lighthouse Foundation Improving Health and Wellbeing, together	\$4,000	We will provide 10 - 15 young people who come from backgrounds of neglect, trauma and homelessness, with outdoor health & fitness opportunities. A personal trainer will work with our care team to run group fitness and nutrition lessons each week. The program involves weekly group sessions facilitated by a Registered Music Therapist (RMT), using children's music - familiar to both young and old - to engage participants, encourage positive intergenerational connections and promote a positive sense of community, health and wellbeing.
Aquatics and Recreation Victoria From Wet2Work	\$5,000	VICSWIM Cultural 'From Wet2Work' project is designed to offer swimming and water safety lessons to women of multicultural communities residing in the City of Melbourne. Lessons introduce them to their community aquatic facility, teach them skills and impart knowledge to enhance their safety in and around water and have a vocational opportunity post lessons. This continues the successful initiation of the service in 2013 in which nutritious breakfasts have been served from 8.45 to 10.00am each Saturday since it commenced in January. Vicdeaf will celebrate the achievements of deaf migrants learning Auslan, by hosting a graduation event in CoM and invite other clients who are deaf with disabilities to support the newcomers, fostering community involvement and participation.
The Big Umbrella The Big Umbrella Melbourne Outreach Services	\$3,000	Seeking funding to support and coordinate the expansion of ongoing community outreach services in the City of Melbourne. TBU has developed and implemented services targeted at supporting the city's homeless community including A ReaL MeaL (ARM), A ReaL ChancE (ARC). These programs provide basic needs and ongoing support to identified individuals within the City of Melbourne.
