## **Docklands community association - Question raised**

- 1. Fireworks what's the future of Fireworks and will they be launched from ETIHAD IN future? Harbour Esplanade Docklands will continue to be a location for one of the City of Melbourne live sites for the New Year's Eve (NYE) event. The firing sites will be located on rooftops as per the city wide NYE fireworks program strategy, therefore fireworks will not be returned to the harbour.
- 2. NYE Fireworks / Chinese NY / Australia Day has CITY OF MELBOURNE Events undertaken an evaluation or feedback as to how the events went

The City of Melbourne does not deliver the Australia Day or Chinese New Year events, therefore cannot comment on where fireworks will be located for these events moving forward.

### **Community request**

1. That CoM Events team present at a future forum to present upcoming events and activations in Docklands.

The City of Melbourne is working collaboratively with the Docklands Chamber of Commerce to ensure all future event information is made readily available to key businesses and all residents will received stakeholder notification of future events should the event represent any significant level of disruption or impact to the precinct.

The City of Melbourne will deliver an event in Winter (June 30, July 1 and July 2) which will involve water based fireworks. The event program for winter is much smaller than NYE and crowd numbers will be significantly less. Given the nature of the event and the anticipated attendance; the risks associated with a water based fireworks program are deemed to be manageable.
