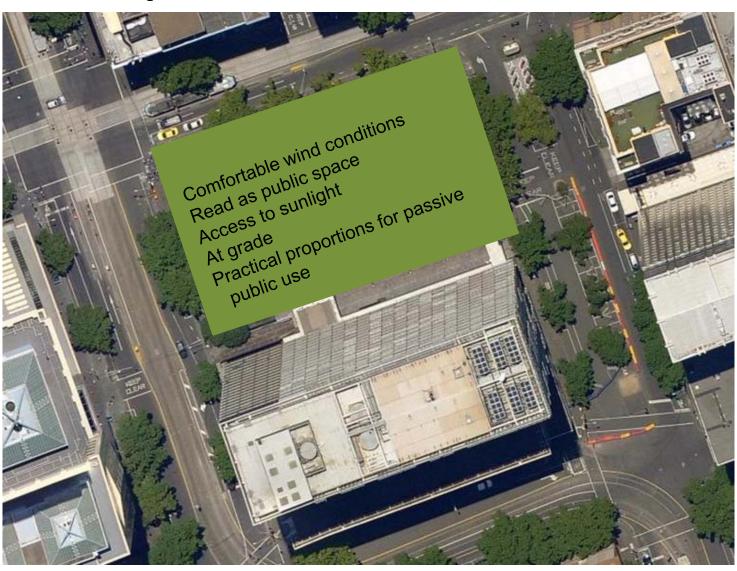
Application for Planning Permit: TP-2013-227, 433-455 Collins Street, Melbourne
