Dear Future Melbourne Committee Members

We are writing on behalf of the Australian Centre for Contemporary Art (ACCA) in support of Planning Scheme Amendment C323 – Melbourne Arts Precinct.

The Melbourne Arts Precinct houses significant arts organisations, both the larger major and heritage organisations producing and presenting work from the artistic canon and the organisations working directly with artists to produce new Australian and international work. Additionally, the University of Melbourne's Victorian College of the Arts (VCA) and the VCA secondary school connects the next generation of young practitioners with professional arts and cultural organisations.

Each of the organisations within the precinct offer exciting opportunities for interaction and access to high quality arts experiences for Melbourne's residents and visitors alike. The vision of a sophisticated city with a multiplicity of dynamic arts offerings easily accessed with in a multi-arts precinct is an inspiring one. However, there are currently significant challenges in terms of *lack* of public amenity, street activation and pedestrian friendly connectivity between arts organisations within the precinct.

These challenges are being addressed in part by different levels of government and cultural organisations and ACCA supports recent developments, welcoming in-particular:

- The City of Melbourne plan for the transformation of Southbank Boulevard and Dodds Street particularly in relation to the creation of a pedestrian friendly, more attractive and people friendly street scape offering greater connectivity.
- The State Government Plan for the National Gallery of Victoria (NGV) and Arts Centre Melbourne development particularly in relation to the public spaces and connectivity and pedestrian access from St Kilda Road to Sturt Street.
- New developments at the University of Melbourne's Victorian College of the Arts campus including the redevelopment of the old Police Stables building and the development of the Conservatorium of Music which will provide permeable pedestrian access from Sturt Street to Dodds Street.

Planning Scheme Amendment C323 – Melbourne Arts Precinct supports a private enterprise contribution to the continuing development of vibrancy and connectivity that compliments the work of the City of Melbourne, the State Government and the educational and not-for- profit organisations within the precinct. Furthermore, the proposal for a mix of uses would contribute to activation throughout the day and into the evening building a more lively precinct. ACCA anticipates that the new planning scheme could potentially provide exciting opportunities for ACCA and our immediate precinct neighbours Malthouse and Chunky Move. Through jointly working with a neighbouring commercial development under Planning Scheme Amendment C323 we believe that we can work to create expanded facilities for arts education programs, improved public amenity and street activation.

We further believe that a well-managed implementation of the Amendment would offer significant opportunity to bring independent arts workers and smaller organisations into the precinct. This would in turn encourage the development of businesses that could contribute to the public amenity and liveliness of the street scape.

We commend the potential of the Planning Scheme Amendment C323 – Melbourne Arts Precinct and would be happy to discuss this with the City of Melbourne should any further information be required.

Lack of transparency, in deed, secrecy and top down decision making was the hallmark of the past lord mayor, Robert Doyle's, in-house culture.

This has lead to an endemic mistrust by traders and the market community of the council, the QVM Board and QVM management.

Under the outlined roles and responsibilities for committee members on the new Trustees Committee,' members are expected to comply with the confidential information provisions contained int the the Local Government Act 1989..... must treat information they receive as confidential unless otherwise advised' ... due to their draft format 'which makes them not ready for wider community distribution' etc etc Why shouldn't the public know the thought thread (the draft) of the decision making process and be able to comment on it as it is developed?

The example of the very popular and successful, North Sydney Mayor from 1974 – 87, Ted Mack, is one worth the City of Melbourne considering. He introduced open government policies making all council meetings, committees and council files open to the public. There were no meetings of any sort from which the public or press were excluded while he was mayor. Council adopted the view that all decision making is ultimately the right of the public not aldermen – irrespective of the merits of the public decision. His achievements were monumental.

Friends of Queen Victoria Market believe that this policy and practice of confidentiality at all levels severely limits the 'deeper & meaningful conversations' that the council wishes to engage in and does little to alleviate the mistrust through secrecy that has pervaded the Doyle culture in council and ask the Council to review this practice.

This submission is in relation to the report to the Future Melbourne Committee proposing an increase in replacement car parking and a new engagement strategy at the Queen Victoria Market (QVM).

As you will be aware, the National Union of Workers represents traders & stallholders at QVM. Our trader members' welcome this report's recognition of the importance of accessible and plentiful car parking to the future of the market. Traders would like Councillors to note that whilst some studies have indicated car parking can be overestimated in its contribution to patronage in a typical 'high street' retail arrangement, this isn't the case at the Queen Victoria Market. Illustrating this point, car parking is essential for regular large and medium volume fresh food buyers - a subsection of the market's customer base fruit and vegetable traders estimate make up upwards of 60% of their volume of sales. Furthermore, traders would attest to the importance of car parking in allowing large family groups, parents with young children, as well as interstate & international tourists to shop at the market.

In regards to the proposal for a 'People's Panel' - our trader members welcome the opportunity to be involved as part of this new engagement approach. However, concerns are held with the recommended process of randomly selecting traders, customers, and community members as panel participants. Instead, trader members of the National Union of Workers would strongly recommend Councillors adopt a process whereby panel participants are democratically elected by fellow traders. Alternatively, the existing Traders Representative Council (TRC) could be utilised to select appropriate, enthusiastic, and thoughtful traders to participate as part of the proposed People's Panel.
