#### 6.2 Recommendations of Aboriginal Volumes 3, 4 and 5 of the Hoddle Grid Heritage Review

The purpose of this report was to provide the Future Melbourne Committee with three volumes of the Hoddle Grid Heritage Review (The Review) which pertain to Aboriginal Heritage (Volume 3), Aboriginal History (Volume 4) and Pre-Contact Aboriginal Archaeology (Volume 5) (Attachment 2); and to provide management's recommendations to implement these volumes of the Review.

  - 1.1. Notes three volumes of the Hoddle Grid Heritage Review which pertain to Aboriginal Heritage (Volume 3), Aboriginal History (Volume 4) and Pre-Contact Archaeology (Volume 5) Attachment 2.
  - 1.2. Authorises management to progress actions to implement the findings of Aboriginal Heritage (Volume 3) as summarised in Attachment 3 including the following:
    - 1.2.1. Record and interpret the places identified in the Review via the Aboriginal Melbourne digital mapping tool.
    - 1.2.2. Consult with Aboriginal Victoria about recognition of Aboriginal values on the Victorian Aboriginal Heritage Register.
    - 1.2.3. Consult with Heritage Victoria about recognition of Aboriginal values on the Victorian Heritage Register, including piloting a change of registration process.
    - 1.2.4. Consult with Heritage Victoria about possible amendment to site information recorded on the Victorian Heritage Inventory.
  - 1.3. Authorises management to publish the Aboriginal History (Volume 4) on the City of Melbourne website following final review by all Traditional Owners.
  - 1.4. Authorises management to implement the recommendations of the Pre-Contact Archaeology (Volume 5) as set out below:
    - 1.4.1. Request the submission of voluntary Cultural Heritage Management Plans with all development applications deemed high impact as defined by the

- Aboriginal Heritage Regulations 2018 in areas identified as having archaeological sensitivity within the site predictive model.
- 1.4.2. Continue to update the site predictive model to recognise additional archaeological evidence regarding the Hoddle Grid.
- 1.4.3. Develop a brochure that provides information to permit applicants on the importance of managing Aboriginal archaeology in urban environments.

# 6.3 Queen Victoria Market Precinct Renewal Program - Provision of Market Infrastructure and Car Parking

The purpose of this report was to report back to the Future Melbourne Committee (FMC) on the analysis of three recommendations in the Queen Victoria Market People's Panel Report (December 2018) in respect to the provision of market infrastructure and investigations into the minority report, including the overall impact of these recommendations on the business case and implementation strategy.

In the preparation of the management report for this item, Justin Hanney, Chief Executive Officer and Michael Tenace, Chief Financial Officer both disclosed an indirect conflict of interest due to a conflicting duty in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1989*. Mr Hanney is a Director of Queen Victoria Market Pty Ltd, and Mr Tenace, is an Alternate Director of Queen Victoria Market Pty Ltd.

- 1. That the Future Melbourne Committee:
  - 1.1. Notes the status of analysis of the three recommendations in the Queen Victoria Market People's Panel Report (December 2018) in respect to the provision of market infrastructure and investigations into the minority report, including the overall impact of these recommendations on the business case and implementation strategy.
  - 1.2. Endorses Option A for the provision of market infrastructure and requests management to undertake more detailed design (considering logistics and OH&S, legal requirements and State Agreement implications, C308 planning requirements, operational implications and costings of market infrastructure in Queen Street) to be presented to a future Council meeting in August 2019 for approval, alongside an updated masterplan and a new implementation framework.
  - 1.3. Notes the approved budget in the QVMPR Business Case (2017) includes allowance of approximately \$6 million for purpose built storage at traders' stalls and requests management undertake extensive consultation with traders before the design comes back to Council for approval.

- 1.4. Notes that other projects identified in the Master Plan are progressing, including:
  - 1.4.1. Heritage shed restoration
  - 1.4.2. Munro site redevelopment delivering 500 market customer carparks
  - 1.4.3. Completion of String Bean Alley retail laneway
  - 1.4.4. Precinct amenity improvements to provide utility upgrades, more pedestrian friendly areas for people of all abilities and better lighting, toilets, outdoor seating, greening and weather protection for customers
  - 1.4.5. Preparation of a Charter and Design Brief for Market Square
  - 1.4.6. Reconfiguration of Southern Development Site land parcels to facilitate a new mixed use development and additional market car parking which integrates the market with the central city
- 1.5. Requests management undertake ongoing consultation with key stakeholders and responds appropriately.
