6.3 Ministerial Planning Referral: ID-2020-5 -850-868 Lorimer Street, Port Melbourne

Submission by Lindsay Gordon

Having only become aware of this application in less than 24 hours before submissions for Council are required, I am somewhat constrained in relation to my comments on it and my back ground research other than the material provided in the Council report.

However, Council, on 8 December 2020, approved a submission to the Minister in relation to number 111 Lorimer Street approximately 500 m in a westerly direction along Lorimer Street from this subject property.

When I became aware of the approval for number 111 Lorimer Street just recently, I became concerned that Council has given its approval to a building proposed to have 29 storeys in an area where the preferred height is only 18 storeys.

Council considered 29 storeys as acceptable even though this was only 11 storeys less that that permitted under the previous Liberal government (40 storeys was permitted). The current government called in all planning cases for the area for the purposes of "sorting out the mess" (this was the publicity at the time) and the main part of the "mess" that was being sorted out was the excessive heights proposed for buildings. This is hardly sorting out the "mess". It is also 60% higher than the preferred maximum height of 18 storeys so I am at a loss to understand the recommended approval.

I appreciate that my comments in relation to 111 Lorimer Street might appear to be unconnected with the current application. However, they are not.

Council appears to have only considered the height aspect insofaras overshadowing is concerned.

With respect, my view is that there is another issue involved and that is a "canyoning" effect on Lorimer Street. What I mean by this is that extremely tall buildings on either side of Lorimer Street will give the effect of a canyon which is not aesthetically pleasing nor environmentally appropriate. It would also exacerbate wind tunnelling with increased wind speeds due to the tunnelling. At present they can be quite significant around the tall buildings even on relatively calm days.

In addition, there are many shadows that will be added to by the addition of this proposed development at 850 Lorimer Street. There are proposed to be 2 towers each of 24 storeys and one of 11 storeys.

In particular, there appears to have been no consideration of the combined shadows of both number 111 Lorimer Street and this property (850 Lorimer Street). What I mean by this is that in the early mornings the shadow of 111 Lorimer Street will be cast in a westerly direction towards 850 Lorimer Street (only 500 m up the road) and then in the afternoon the shadow form 850 Lorimer Street will be cast in an easterly direction towards number 111 Lorimer Street thereby creating a double (i.e. twice during the day) shading of the properties along Lorimer Street in between both buildings. Exacerbating this will be the shadowing created from the north-easterly, northerly and north-westerly sun by the newly constructed Voyager and the existing Forge buildings.

In my view, without having completed the computations but as a "gut feeling", I suspect that many of the buildings from number 111 Lorimer Street through to 850 Lorimer Street (i.e. on the south side of Lorimer Street) could well end up in virtually an all day shadow when the combined effect of all of these buildings is added together with the shadows moving with the sun.

This sort of thing can have a substantial detrimental effect on these buildings and particularly should the owners or occupiers wish to install, for example, solar panels or other ecologically sound developments requiring sunshine. It may also impact gardens. I don't think that this aspect has been considered and it should be. It may well have been the case that had any of the owners been aware of these applications that they could have made submissions based on their substantially reduced direct sunlight hours due to the combined effect of all the tall buildings bearing in mind that the proposals for the current application as well as the previous application for 111 Lorimer Street. Overall, I don't believe that this is good planning practice.

From Council's briefing paper it appears that the preferred height for the site is only 11 storeys, however, there is no explanation or clarity in the report as to whether the briefing paper (and therefore the approval) is only for stage 1 or both stages 1 and 2. I would suggest that if it is for both stages 1 and 2 then the proposed height of 2 of the buildings at 2 ½ times the preferred height of 10 stories is manifestly inappropriate. Council should refuse to support the application in its current form with its proposed building heights.

Furthermore, as has been noted no public comment has been received because it is not *required* however, with all due respect that does not mean that Council should *not* seek public input from the ratepayers. It is a very small cost for publicity to be provided to those in the vicinity by way of a newspaper advertisement such as in the Docklands News or by a mail out or other such publicity perhaps involving social media (there are a number of Facebook pages for the area). I would have to say that the lack of publicity may suggest to some ratepayers that the decision is being made secretively. However, I may well just not be aware of any publicity that may have occurred surrounding it.

I do not believe that the current application should be approved in its present form and, whilst it is not directly the subject of this specific application, the recommended approval by the Minister for 111 Lorimer Street should be revisited and revoked.

I do not believe that these buildings should be approved in isolation but the entire locality should be planned as a whole. It is my view that planning the locality as a whole would result in far better outcomes other than a piecemeal approach of approving individual site specific planning scheme amendments.

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to endorse the design of the Brens and Ryder Pavilions in Royal Park and to convey why we feel this redevelopment is not only necessary, but long overdue. As the first two female players to hold positions on the Melbourne University Rugby Football Club (MURFC) Committee, we are grateful to finally have a platform to voice why we feel so strongly about an upgrade of our club's facilities.

The Brens and Ryder Pavilion is a clear relic of a 1950s men's only clubhouse that fails to provide usable and welcoming facilities for all players, staff, spectators and families. For example, the location of the central communal shower and exposed toilet area makes it impossible to access the small female change room without having to walk past teams of male players walking between their change rooms and the shower area. The nature of the open area leaves little to the imagination. This makes us and our female teammates feel uncomfortable, unwelcome, unsafe and very much out of place in our own club. This also makes it incredibly unsuitable for junior players and families to freely move throughout the clubhouse.

More and more women are joining rugby and AFL clubs in Victoria. We believe the proposed design will address current issues of equity, safety, suitability and capacity of the facilities for women in the following ways:

- individual access to each of the change rooms drastically improves the usability, providing the privacy required to make us feel safe and comfortable to use them
- the addition of change rooms and increased size of the social space means that when both the women's and men's teams host opponents, the facilities can cater for all equally
- the changes to the building also demonstrate we are valued equally as part of the sporting and wider community

MURFC is becoming increasingly diverse, and we as a wider community need to adapt and improve in order for all members and their families to feel welcome, safe and recognised. We want to feel empowered and supported by our club. We want to be proud of where we train, play and socialise. We want you to hear and recognise our plight as underrepresented and currently inferior members of the rugby and sporting world in Victoria. This is why we have had members of the women's team attend consultation meetings, and as a club sought and provided key input to develop a concept that we feel provides an equal outcome and suitable solution.

SUBMISSION FUTURE MELBOURNE COMMITTEE FEB 16, 2021 – ITEM 6.5 BRENS AND RYDER PAVILIONS, ROYAL PARK

Applications to redevelop the Brens and Ryder sports pavilions in Royal Park are assessed and determined by Heritage Victoria because Royal Park is on the Heritage Victoria Register (H2337). Despite there being exemptions for permit requirements, the proposed developments do not include design and information that should be included in the Heritage Victoria application, so that the applications can be properly and fully assessed.

The Friends of Royal Park, Parkville has raised the following matters that should be addressed before the Heritage Victoria application is lodged:

- Not shown on the plans are the service areas, where bins will be stored, and the access to these areas. These areas will constitute larger overall footprints to the pavilions ... and impacts on parkland. How are these areas and their impacts to be addressed and mitigated in the plans?
- 2. Given the larger built form of the new pavilions in the landscape context, what mitigation in the form of colour schemes and materials will be put in place to reduce the visual impact of the buildings in their park settings?
- 3. Details of lighting at the new pavilions should be specified in the plans in keeping with Council's Public Lighting Strategy applicable to Royal Park, i.e. that as a natural park, it be designated a 'dark park' stray light from buildings should be minimised and sports facilities should only be lit when sports activities are occurring and be turned off by 10pm. Thus, light design, lux, timing, etc associated with the new pavilions should be specified in the plans.
- 4. Environmental sustainability is supposed to be included in Council developments. The number, size and location of rainwater tanks at the two new pavilions should be shown on the plans. Preferably they should be located underground to avoid loss and impact on parkland.
- 5. Car parking areas should be precisely shown on the plans. In keeping with Council policies, car parking in parkland should be discouraged and minimised. Car parking numbers at Brens Pavilion are to be reduced to 20, however, fencing must be included in the plans to prevent vehicle encroachment onto parkland. What measures to reduce car parking areas are to be implemented in association with the redevelopment of the Ryder Pavilion (noting the reduction in car parking for the Western Pavilion in Royal Park)?
- 6. The historic scorers boxes at Ryder Pavilion site should be retained, not "relocated" to some "agreed" location.

In addition, in considering the overall plans for the new Brens and Ryder Pavilions in Royal Park, the Council is also asked to consider:

- Given 'No Net Loss of Parkland' in park developments, for Ryder, which will increase from 420sqm to 745sqm, where will compensatory parkland be provided?
- Given current difficult access off Macarthur Road will remain, for the foreseeable future, could a KEEP CLEAR be painted on the road surface so that vehicles entering and exiting the Brens Pavilion site can more easily and safely access/egress the site?

6.5 Endorsement of the schematic design plans and provision of a project update for Brens and Ryder pavilions in Royal Park

University High School-Victoria University Amateur Football Club wishes to 100% endorse the design plans and project at Brens Oval that is before council. As a winter tenant at Brens Oval since 1960, our club sees this project as the biggest advancement in the proud history of our club. In late 2018 when the project started to take shape, we were visited by the local member Ellen Sandell. She was so moved by the current lack of basic amenities, especially for women and girls, that she brought up her support specifically in parliament. In 2017 we introduced Women's football but could only raise enough players for one team. There were many potential players who did not commit because of our current amenities. Since the City of Melbourne designs have been displayed and circulated we have had a groundswell of women wishing to join. It is with great pride that we announce that in season 2021 we have entered 2 Women's team in the VAFA. We will wait till the project is complete before we will passionately commence our commitment to junior teams.

This project will mean that our 60 women and 110 male members for the first time will have access to single change rooms with dedicated private cubicle showers and toilets within. There are 4 ovals in our precinct meaning 8 teams playing at a time, so the provision of the minimum 8 change rooms is much appreciated. The allocation of a separate medical room where injured players can be cared for with privacy is a great modern day improvement. Umpire rooms have been appropriately included in the design to acknowledge their key role in sporting activities. There is also a toilet space designated for LGBTIQ users of the park and pavilion.

The increased area in the social rooms and kitchen will allow our football community space to meet, greet and further develop friendships. Thursday night meals after training will mean everyone can at last eat sitting down in the same shared space, with no more overflow of players huddling outside. Visiting teams will now have the appropriate amount of space to join us to celebrate the days' competition.

It is an entirely appropriate generational design that takes into account all stakeholders needs. The overall net loss/gain of parkland will be minimal and should not act as a distraction or deterrent to this much needed project.

Future Melbourne Committee 16 February 2021Agenda item 6.6 – Community Engagement PolicySubmission by Dr Stan Capp,Exhibition Street, Melbourne Vic 3000

I think the recommended policy is a professional attempt at addressing this most important initiative and, if adopted as presented, will adequately satisfy the requirements of the Local Government Act 2020.

However, had the consultation on this subject adopted best practice, the recommended document would have been issued as a draft and the community of stakeholders could have been given the opportunity to comment **prior** to the final recommended policy being submitted to FMC. In order to allow further input and potential amendment, Councillors could defer consideration of the policy until its next scheduled meeting on 23 February 2021, understanding the need to adopt by 1 March 2021.

I recommend that the *"FMC invite community feedback beyond the period applicable for this meeting and request that officers re-submit an amended recommendation to the next scheduled Council meeting."*

The policy as presented is somewhat generic and has few distinctly City of Melbourne characteristics. I accept that the consultation has been widespread, but it is unclear to me what was actually taken up from the plethora of ideas and initiatives that through personal experience, I know were submitted. For example, of the 24 contributions listed on the "Big Ideas" page, there were at least five worthy of inclusion, if only within Attachment 3. I can see no such acknowledgment let alone inclusion.

One of the most important omissions or missed opportunities from the policy is a section on "**how**" community engagement will be activated apart from reference to the Participate Melbourne initiative, which I regard as an excellent but somewhat formulaic process used by City of Melbourne.

There are a range of options for engagement that a policy statement should define and these include but are not restricted to:

- 1. People's Panels
- 2. Resident Panels
- 3. Citizen Juries
- 4. Focus Groups
- 5. Quantitative Surveys
- 6. Qualitative Surveys,
- 7. Opinion Polls e.g. via a phone app

If the FMC does **not** wish to seek the inclusion of an analysis of these contemporary albeit minimal processes for engagement within the current policy, then I recommend: *"Council seeks a further paper be prepared by Officers to enable Councillors to better understand the options that can put into effect the principles approved in the Community Engagement Strategy. The paper should also define criteria to be applied to determine which of the agreed processes will be utilised."* If City of Melbourne wishes to build on its leadership in the Local Government sector by being a *"bold, inspirational and sustainable city",* then it needs to explicitly display innovation and awareness of how community engagement will be put into action. At the moment, the policy remains silent on this and, in my opinion, diminishes what is proposed.

The other outstanding omission is the lack of reference to **residents** who represent the single largest interest group and number of ratepayers within the City of Melbourne. At the very least, the definition of "community" should include a specific reference to residents and elsewhere in the body of the document, reference to residents should be highlighted. While the reference on page 15 is acknowledged, specific inclusion in the analysis of roles and responsibilities on page 17 is indicated as is explicit recognition in the Policy Statement.

I think a more inclusive discussion of "community" would be appropriate. The key stakeholders within the community are residents, businesses, workers, students, tourists, with acknowledgement of indigenous and other under-represented groups.

I understand that the Act requires that Councils apply their community engagement policy in the development of the following:

- planning and financial management
- community vision
- council plan
- financial plan
- revenue and rating planning
- asset plan

Similar but not identical processes can be established in any area where Councillors would benefit from community input. What is needed is a willingness to receive advice through a formalised structure of eliciting community views. There is now a legislative requirement that they do so in the designated areas, and I anticipate that a broad interpretation of the *Community Engagement Policy* will become embedded in the work of the City of Melbourne.

This will be challenging for both Councillors and Council staff. However, the outcomes are more likely to reflect community views and be to the overall benefit of all. I know that I and others will welcome this application of the policy.

The motion by Cr Leppert is a good start but it does not go far enough in my opinion. It has also been revealed that a guard in the hotel worked on Friday 12th February, 2021, whilst experiencing cold and flu symptoms. The men are all now forced to isolate in their rooms as they have possibly been exposed to COVID–19 due to the irresponsibility of

guards working when sick.

As a Melbourne-based medical doctor, I call on the City of Melbourne to take immediate action to end the arbitrary and risk-prone detention of asylum seekers at the Park Hotel in Carlton.

Over several months, I have had the privilege to speak with several men held initially at Bell City Mantra, and now at the Park Hotel in Carlton. Having fled their homes due to unimaginable pain and suffering, they have spent nearly a decade in arbitrary detention.

Their mental health has deteriorated. They are resilient, but all resilience has limits.

The Federal Government has detained Refugees and Asylum Seekers in an alternative place of detention, at 701 Swanston Street, Carlton, since December 2020. These human beings in particular, were evacuated to Australia under the Medevac Bill, as they had urgent medical conditions that needed to be addressed. Some of these people were released into the community, though some remain in detention for unknown reasons. They've since been locked in hotels indefinitely. Prior to being locked up within the City of Melbourne, they were locked up in the City of Darebin. Darebin Council acted to publicly condemn the Federal Government regarding the detention and torture of these people. The City of Melbourne Council, as a collective, needs to do the same, should it claim to be a "Refugee Welcome Zone". I urge all Councillors and Council Officers to act within the best interest of all our residents, including these innocent refugees, who are now residents of this Council.

I am calling on Lord Mayor, Sally Capp; Deputy Lord Mayor, Nicholas Reece; and all Councillors to live up to Council's statements and stand up for humanity. As Councillors elected to this Council, it is your job and your

I note that I am highly disturbed & dismayed that the City of Melbourne has allowed this political prison holding refugees extrajudicially and in inhumane conditions to operate with full, unquestioned, complicit protection & cooperation... in contravention to international human rights conventions & obligations undertaken by the Commonwealth of Australia, and with flagrant disregard to the good standing, reputation, and values of justice, decency, dignity, and human rights that the City of Melbourne is supposed to uphold.

These people have been detained for over 7 years on Manus Island & Nauru and have now been locked in hotel rooms or Apods and detention centres for well over 12 months. The medical treatment they were supposed to receive is not forthcoming. Australia has failed them. One young man a Rohingya refugee, at The Park Prison is 24! He was detained as a minor, just 17 years old.

How have we become so cruel?

Refugees are given a special status in international law in recognition that they have lost protection in their own country. Article 31 of the Refugee Convention affords the refugee the right not to be penalised for illegal entry, the right to work (article 17) the right to housing (article 21)

It is not a crime to seek asylum from persecution or other serious human rights abuses, regardless of how you arrive. Under the a Refugee Convention, entering a Country without a visa must not be treated as illegal if a person

is seeking asylum.

Australia has a rich history of welcoming refugees since 1945. Detterence tactics, such as turning back boats, offshore processing and temporary protection, take no account of the underlying human rights violations that prompt asylum seekers to make dangerous sea journeys. They punish one group to deter another, contrary to human rights law. As UNHCR chief Filippo Grandi said of Australia's policies ' There is a fundamental contradiction in saving people at sea, only to mistreat and neglect them on land'

Let's live up to our commitment as a 'Refugee Welcome Zone' and appeal to the Federal Government to end this torture permanently.

Detained refugees in Australia are some of the most persecuted people on the planet. Not-only have they fled some of the most oppressive conditions one could imagine, putting their lives at risk to come here having no other option, but after having done so they have had their persecution continued in our name, using our taxpayer dollars. Spend on our offshore detention policy has averaged a billion dollars a year. Imagine how many Australians could be helped with this money. Our bushfire victims, our homeless population, our farmers all of whom are in constant need of our support. Not to mention these refugees, for whom it would be exponentially cheaper to support rather than oppress.

On this topic, the support extended to released refugees has been dismal. These people have finally been granted their freedom, after up to 8 years in detention, but how free are they in practice? They are not entitled to Centrelink, their visas are only for 6 months, they have been given \$307 to live off and yet they are not able to undertake any study that would make them employable (ranging from tafe to RSA certificates). Restarting your life in a foreign country is hard enough, let alone doing so after what these people have been through, so why would we not want to give them the same opportunities to thrive and succeed as other Australians. We need to give these people the best possible chance to contribute to society in a manner that will benefit our country in the greatest possible way. This, incidentally, is also the ideal outcome from a humanitarian perspective, showing these

individuals a level of basic respect as fellow humans. These people have faced a lifetime of torture that cannot easily be undone, and this is not what I am requesting of our government. Instead we simply ask that you give these people the best possible chance to improve their dire situation, not to undo the harm done, but to try and prevent its intensification.

Our asylum seeker policy wasn't founded on any legitimate basis. There is no ethical or economic foundation to it that hasn't since been shown to be, at best shaky and for the most part just plainly false. We have drawn criticism ranging from the UN to Kim Jong-un. We understand now that these people have become pawns for government votes and that there is no basic consideration shown towards them as fellow human beings. We need to find it within ourselves to rewrite this dark chapter for Australia and place ourselves on the right side of history. Dear Lord Mayor Sally Capp, Deputy Lord Mayor Nicholas Reece and fellow Melbourne City Councillors,

I am disgusted that you have been allowing ticket inspectors and other local level administrative matters like inappropriate wielding of anti-busking laws pressure and punish dissenting community members from your plan to support the torture, punishment and imprisonment of the Medevac refugees at the Park hotel detention since December 2020. Your leader's actions mean the Melbourne City Council is aiding and abetting the organised torture and imprisonment of legally recognised refugees, and moreover, people who have committed no crime and are in fact not alleged to have committed any crime.

Doing so contravenes the UN Convention on the Rights of Refugees, while doing so in what you branded as a "Refugee Welcome Zone" contravenes your own basic humanity and claims to decency, rationality and order. I hope your subconscious is ashamed and disturbs you against your conscious choices. I ask you to reflect: is this the purpose of government? Is this why you ran?

I call on all councillors to urgently request the Minister for Home Affairs, Peter Dutton and Prime Minister Scott Morrison to: 1. Immediately release the remaining refugees at the Park Hotel into the community.

2. Provide recently released refugees with a permanent pathway to citizenship, access to JobSeeker and access to post-secondary educational and training opportunities.

"I further call on all Melbourne City Councillors to:

3. Issue a written complaint to the Andrews government about the behaviour of police at the Park Hotel site, performing a "wedge" maneuvre to break up a peaceful protest on Saturday 16th January. During this maneuvre, the group's 2 assigned police liaison officers were assaulted by Victoria Police, with one being thrown to the cement, and another punched in the face by police. Both liaison officers were women of colour, and the incidents were captured on social media.

4. Issue a written invitation to the Andrews government to join you in your appeal to the federal government viz the first 2 points above, and to stop tolerating the Park Hotel site on the grounds that it is an ongoing series of Crimes Against Humanity, which are also codified in Australian Law under The International Criminal Court Act 2002 (Commonwealth).

If the council is unable to effect these actions, I call on dissenting councillors to censure Lord Mayor Sally Capp, who by taking actions to actively engage in the torture and imprisonment of legally recognised refugees, has failed to demonstates the principles of Councillor Conduct. By aiding and abetting torture and imprisonment of people who have not committed a crime, including by taking steps to impede and punish local community citizens in your own electorate who cannot believe you are letting the Park Hotel torture experiment happen, Capp has failed to "act with integrity" and "impartially exercise responsibilities in the interests of the local community". Capp has failed in her obligation to "treat all persons with respect"; "exercise reasonable care and diligence"; "endeavour to ensure that public resources are used prudently and in the public interest"; "act lawfully"; "and lead by example and act in a way that secures public confidence in the office of Councillor".

Your electorate does not want these human rights abuses to continue, not at all and not under the banner of your gaslighting hypocrisy of Melbourne as a supposed "Refugee Welcome Zone". You demean the purpose of all our lives with your actions, and your inaction.

I write to urge the City of Melbourne and all its Councillors to acknowledge and protest the cruel and immoral detention of all legal asylum seekers and refugees within the bounds of the City of Melbourne.

As a signatory to the Refugees Welcome Zone Declaration, I call on the Melbourne City Council to pass this motion and condemn Australia's ongoing egregious treatment of refugees.

Right now there are 13 men being held as prisoners at the Park Hotel at 701 Swanston Street Carlton, each of these men are here in Melbourne because their homes have become unlivable and they've had no choice but to seek refuge elsewhere, coming to Australia in an effort to be free of persecution, and unfortunately have not found any such freedom. The Australian government has an obligation to help those in need rather than needlessly punish them, especially in the absence of any actual crime being committed.

I don't want to seem naive, I've thought long and hard about why they are being kept in detention when it seemingly advantages no-one, not even the Australian public. All 13 of these men have the right to seek asylum, a humanitarian would call it a flagrant abuse of human rights, a capitalist would say it is unnecessarily putting the taxpayer out of pocket. I can think of almost no lense through which to view this issue that helps me to understand the internal logic of the decisions made by the Australian government regarding this issue. There is only one way for me to understand these actions, and that is that the Australian government takes pride in this racist, bigoted and discrimitory policy that seeks to harm and alienate anyone who is different than us in the interest of "preserving" a culture that is already deeply rooted in immigration.

The 13 men at the park hotel have not seen freedom for almost 8 years, and for approximately 574 days they have not been let out of their hotel accommodation. They aren't allowed to walk in the park, or go grocery shopping, or see any family. This past year we've all personally felt what it's like to be isolated from the rest of the world, and even we have been granted the aforementioned concessions. These men have nothing, no plan for the future, no expectations of happiness, no life, they are all in limbo. For no reason. Furthermore the treatment they receive at the prison they live in is unacceptable, their windows have been tinted under the guise of "climate control" inside a hotel with air conditioning so that their friends on the outside are unable to see them. Their meal times are scheduled to coincide with the daily protests that are held outside the hotel so that they have to choose between seeing their friends and eating dinner. We also just recently learnt that a guard working at the hotel on Friday the 12th of February was exhibiting cold and flu symptoms and as a result all the men are being made to further self isolate inside their rooms, giving up even the interactions they are allowed to have with each other.

I want the Melbourne City Council to support this motion. Melbourne City is officially a refugee welcome zone, a sentiment I can only imagine is beyond irony to the men who feel distinctly unwelcome here. I support this motion and think it is the duty of the Melbourne City council to show compassion and benevolence towards these men by defending them against the Australian Government.

As a signatory to the Refugees Welcome Zone Declaration, I call on the Melbourne City Council to pass this motion and condemn Australia's ongoing deplorable treatment of refugees.

Currently, 13 men are still being held in indefinite detention in the Park Hotel in Melbourne whilst others are being detained at Melbourne Immigration Transit Accommodation (MITA). These men have all been granted refugee status, and should be resettled in Australia permanently in accordance with Australia's obligation to ensure basic human rights for asylum seekers and refugees. These include the right to freedom, and the right to seek asylum.

These men have been detained for 8 years for attempting to seek a safer life here in Australia. 8 years ago these men decided to flee their home countries because their lives were being threatened by war, violence and genocide. I have no doubt that any Australian would make the same decision if faced with these grave circumstances.

I was brought up on the idea that Australia is a welcoming country, but the Federal government's treatment of refugees completely shatters that ideal. It is clear that our welcoming nature only extends to certain people, from certain places and under certain circumstances. Over the past month I have befriended many of the men who still remain in the Park Hotel and MITA. In spite of Australia's ongoing abuse of these men, they want nothing but to build a life here and be part of the Australian community.

All Melbournians know how it feels to experience a lockdown where our freedoms are limited and we are deprived of socialising. These refugees have been in a far more severe lockdown without even access to fresh air for up to 20 months. Melbournians' resistance to the lockdown was largely due to concerns for people's mental health. The mental health of these men is suffering greatly. It is imperative that we extend this same concern to them especially considering that they have no access to mental health support.

The way that the guards in the hotel, employed by Serco, treat these men has intensified their suffering deeply. Their inhumanity and cruelty involves: constantly threatening the men; putting up tinting on the hotel windows in an attempt to obscure them from city-goers and the protestors; and changing meal times so that the men have to choose between seeing their friends at the daily protests or eating dinner. The lack of concern for the wellbeing and safety of the men is evident in how one Serco worker came to work on Friday 12th February, 2021, despite experiencing cold and flu symptoms. This irresponsible decision caused the men to become extremely distressed and they had to isolate in their rooms in case the worker tested positive for COVID-19.

I call on Melbourne City Council to support this motion, and uphold the values associated with being a Refugee Welcome Zone. As a concerned community member, I strongly support this motion, and encourage Melbourne City Council to defend these innocent men seeking safety and freedom in our community. I was surprised to learn that the Fly Neighbourly Agreement had, by delegation, been discontinued and removed from Council's website. This gave me a sense of déjà vu re. the art installations on the median strip outside NGVI which seemed to have undergone a similar process of delegation without reference to council.

As I live in close walking distance of the Melbourne Sports Precinct and Parliament, I am very familiar with noise activity from overhead aircraft. Covid 19 restrictions have lessened this somewhat, but the potential return to previous patterns is a worry.

I support this NoM because it indicates Council's initiative in taking the first steps before old flight habits become the norm. Council's past initiative in these matters has been noted. The "Call to Parties" at the 2019 Federal election set out its concern regarding aircraft noise over Inner Melbourne. Also, Lord Mayor Capp's submission to the Air Services Amendment Bill 2018 formalised this. As a community we felt very encouraged.

Reinstating the Fly Neighbourly Agreement shows Council's interest and willingness to act and be involved as much as it can, to progress what has already been started. Certainly, the Agreement will make operators aware of Council's position sooner rather than later, when non-essential flights over Melbourne are resumed. It goes without saying that I thank Council and support this initiative.

We are writing in support of the proposal that the Council reinstate the Fly Neighbourly Agreement.

We were quite astounded to learn that Council had not continued with this initiative and had disbanded it without consultation with affected communities. Most concerning and a poor reflection on Council, given community representatives worked for over 18 months with Council supporting Council officers (Gordon Harrison) in crafting and implementing this policy.

We reiterate in support of the reintroduction of the FNA that:

• On some days over 150 flights have been recorded and some of these are doing many circuits - sometimes more than 30.

• For nearly a decade our community has been suffering from increasing flights over our residences and public spaces. In high density flyover periods our amenity is severely impacted. The noise is not only a nuisance, but there are many health studies which have shown that aircraft noise can cause significant health impacts. This is also of concern given the age cohort of our community. There are many elderly people and numerous hospitals and the

impact on these people is particularly problematic. The numerous flights over inner Melbourne spoil people's experience of enjoying our wonderful public parks.

• Given the density of our population, tourism, joy flights and training flights should not occur. This flows to safety with so many aircraft flying in a concentrated space with only Visual Flight Rules applying – VFR simply requires pilots to look out for each other. There was a helicopter crash near the MCG some years ago and we fear with increasing density of air traffic the risks increase .

• Council has a duty to protect the well-being of its residents - the FNA is one way of doing this and should never have been allowed to lapse but rather strengthened.

• While the FNA is voluntary and cannot force operators to adopt more considerate flight paths, it is an important mechanism for raising awareness and educating operators about the human impact of their flights. There are alternatives to flying over dense residential areas – flying over transport corridors, industrial areas and the Bay and this applied many years ago, however regulators have allowed a more open slather approach which in our view from a community amenity, impacts on the human and natural environment, a misguided decision. Council should be aware that many capital cities around the world restrict flights over their central areas. While Council does not have the legislative mandate to adopt this, the FNA sends a strong message.

• The previous FNA focused solely on helicopters, but it had been agreed with Council that the FNA was then to be extended in subsequent versions to other categories of aircraft like light fixed wing etc which are a big part of the problem. Also, given that Council and the State government are supportive of EVOTL aircraft and drones it is even more imperative that appropriate protocols and flight path restrictions are designed, implemented and enforced with this emerging use of our precious airspace.

We are often unable to enjoy normal conversation, even inside our house, with the noise coming through closed doors and windows being excessive resulting in paused conversations, video and phone calls and inability to hear TV/RADIO.

Of particular concern lately is the impact on working and schooling from home due to the COVID 19 pandemic requirements. Offices are still not back to full capacity and so many of us are working from home with he need to be on frequent video and phone calls. The aircraft noise is a severe impediment to productivity and causes a great deal of stress in the working/studying environments.

The frequent, loud noise creates a significant level of tension and stress, and frequently disturbs our children's

sleep, and ours also given that flights persist into the night and early morning. As an East Melbourne resident, I strongly support the proposal for Council to reinstate the Fly Neighbourly Agreement.

For nearly a decade the East Melbourne community has been suffering from increasing flights over our homes as well as our private and public gardens. On some days over 150 flights have been recorded and some of these flights are doing many circuits around the East Melbourne area, sometimes more than 30.

The impact of these flights on our ability to enjoy being in our residences and gardens is severe. Sometimes personal conversation must stop, even inside our House, because of the noise that exaggerates within our Courtyard of our residence, that sits directly below the flight paths.

The noise is not only a nuisance, but there are many studies which have shown that aircraft noise can cause significant health impacts, including for disturbing sleep at any time during the day and night.

That said, we are seriously concerned about the safety aspects of so many aircraft flying in a concentrated space with only Visual Flight Rules, which simply requires pilots to look out for each other. I am aware that there was a helicopter crash near the MCG some years ago.

Whilst the FNA is voluntary and cannot force operators to adopt more considerate flight paths, it is an important mechanism for raising awareness and educating operators about the human impact of their flights.

Whilst the previous FNA focused on helicopters, it should also be extended to include light fixed wing aircraft, which presently is a major problem.

There are alternatives to flying over dense residential areas, such as flying over transport corridors, industrial areas and even over Port Philip Bay. Port Philip Bay provides a safety benefit, if in the event that such aircraft suffers a crash landing. I stand to be corrected, but prior to government deregulation, such fixed wing aircraft from Moorabbin Airport to Essendon Airport would use such route.

Council has a duty to protect the well-being of its residents and the FNA is one way of doing this. Many capital cities around the world restrict flights over their central areas. Whilst Council cannot force this, the FNA sends a strong message.

Finally, Council should use the FNA to advocate on behalf of its community with federal politicians and Air Services Australia and the Civil Aviation Safety Authority.

Submission from Susan Henderson, EMG Amenities Convenor and Resident.

As a resident of East Melbourne and the Amenities Convenor of the East Melbourne Group, I strongly support the proposal for Council to reinstate the Fly Neighbourly Agreement. There has been significant increase in number and duration of flights over our homes in recent years. The numerous flights over inner Melbourne are intrusive on our private areas and spoil our family's enjoyment of outdoor spaces and public parks. This has a significant effect on our health, wellbeing and enjoyment of our home and the area in general.

We are often unable to enjoy normal conversation, even inside our house, with the noise coming through closed doors and windows being excessive resulting in paused conversations, video and phone calls and inability to hear TV/RADIO. Pets are also disturbed and stressed.

Offices are still not back to full capacity and so many of us are working or studying from home with the need to be on frequent video and phone calls. The aircraft noise is a severe impediment to productivity and causes a great deal of stress in the working/studying environments.

The frequent loud noise creates a significant level of tension and stress, and frequently disturbs our sleep, given that flights persist into the night and early morning. This noise is not only a nuisance, but there are many studies which have shown that aircraft noise can cause significant health impacts, especially due to stress. It should not be ignored that frequent, loud noise (especially when disturbing sleep) is an internationally recognised form of torture! Our residents are suffering unnecessarily.

Many of the flights over our home are joy and training flights, with aircraft often circling up to 30 times and hovering for extended periods. These flights should not be permitted over one of Melbourne's most densely populated areas as they present a significant safety hazard. These flight movements are unrelated to any normal commuting or essential travel. It is hard to imagine that the circuits above the inner city would pass any public benefit test that could be applied. Given the application of Visual Flight Rules, there are serious safety issues creating unnecessary risks.

To this end, the Council has a duty of care to protect the well-being of its residents and the FNA is one demonstrable, though unfortunately not enforceable way of doing this. While the FNA is voluntary and cannot force operators to adopt more considerate flight paths, it is an important mechanism for raising awareness and educating operators about the human impact of their flights.

Many capital cities around the world do restrict flights over their central areas. While Council cannot force this, the FNA sends a strong message. We would hope that the FNA will be extended to include light fixed wing aircraft in addition to helicopters. It is hoped also that council can and will advocate on behalf of its community with federal politicians and Airservices Australia.

We strongly support the agreement and request that it be strengthened where possible. I am pleased that the Council are taking this matter seriously and I encourage advocacy to other agencies to reduce and hopefully eliminate this scourge.

During that time (apart from the recent Covid-19 affected period) there has been a noticeable increase in the

frequency of flights over the residential streets of East Melbourne.

There has also been a noticeable increase in noise as the airplanes seem to fly very low.

On a bad day, there is a constant stream of large commercial planes flying within a very narrow corridor, almost directly over Gipps St, East Melbourne.

The planes seem to fly at all hours of the day and it's not uncommon that we are woken from sleeping at 2, 3 or 4 am.

As a separate matter, it's also concerning that numerous small aeroplanes and helicopters seem to fly in random paths over East Melbourne residential areas and parklands. As a resident I strongly support the proposal for Council to reinstate the Fly neighbourly Agreement.

We strongly support reinstatement and strengthening of the FNA, noting that it should not have been allowed to lapse in the first place without community engagement and a formal Council decision.

Local government is the most important tier of government in having a fundamental responsibility to protect the wellbeing of its residents. While local government has no regulatory powers over aviation, FNAs represent a significant instrument with which Councils can interact with aircraft operators to promote consideration of their impacts on the human environment.

Therefore, in reinstating the FNA, Council should actively engage with operators, reminding them that consideration of their negative impact on the health and wellbeing of people should be seen as a fundamental aspect of their social licence to operate.

The health impacts of the numerous flights over our homes by helicopters and light aircraft are very significant and the suffering of many people in our neighbourhood is real and serious. There are many scientific studies demonstrating the detrimental health impacts of aircraft noise and measurements taken by residents show that the noise levels are severe. We are not seeking to stop all flights but are calling for operators to follow agreed routes which minimise the impact on people. Many of these flights, including training flights, should not operate over one of Melbourne's most densely populated areas.

We are also concerned about the safety aspects. Helicopters and fixed wing aircraft operate on a VFR basis over our homes and major central Melbourne facilities. This means they simply have to watch out for each other to avoid crashing. While aviation, especially for large commercial flights is safe, Australian Transport Safety Board statistics show that in 2019, 222 aircraft were involved in accidents in Australia, with a further 155 aircraft involved in serious incidents (an incident with a high probability of becoming an accident). That is an average of more than one accident or incident every day per year and we have a well–founded concern that there is an unnecessary risk of so many flights occurring in a concentrated area.

The air traffic over inner Melbourne also impacts on our much-vaunted liveability. Vienna, with whom we often compete for this accolade, does not allow general aviation over its centre and this is the case with many other major cities internationally.

Councillors, you have a duty of care towards residents, please exercise this by giving your full support for strong and effective Fly Neighbourly Agreements, applying both to helicopters and light general aircraft.
