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1. Commencement of meeting and apologies

The meeting commenced at 5.30pm.

The Chair, Lord Mayor Sally Capp, advised that:

- the meeting was being streamed live and that an audio and video recording would be made available on the City of Melbourne website before close of business tomorrow

5. Public questions

Melbourne Food and Wine Festival

Chris Thrum asked a question relating to the City of Melbourne's involvement in the Melbourne Food and Wine Festival and whether there would be any music events incorporated into the festival.

The following response was provided by Louise Scott, Director Tourism and Events and read out by City Activation Portfolio Lead Cr Campbell.

The City of Melbourne (CoM) supports the Melbourne Food & Wine Festival (MFWF) through sponsorship under the Event Partnership Program and has partnered with MFWF for over 17 years. MFWF previously estimated that \$6.1m of economic impact was delivered to the city through the delivery of the festival.

CoM's support will this year go towards free programming at the Queen Vic Market.

MFWF will have some music at events such as 'Welcome to the Jungle' and 'New Crush' however MFWF is not considered a significant music event.

CoM is supporting a number of music based events in 2022 which include:

- Midsumma Festival
- Vida Melbourne Latin Festival
- Lonsdale Street Greek Festival
- o Arriba Melbourne Mexican Festival

6. Reports from management

City Planning Portfolio

Finalisation of the Heritage Places Inventory - Melbourne Planning Scheme Amendment C396 6.1

7.1 Notice of Motion, Cr Leppert: City of Melbourne electoral review

- 1. That the Future Melbourne Committee:
 - 1.1. Notes the statement by the Local Government Inspectorate of 22 February 2022 (Attachment 1), disclosing that 5 warnings were issued to persons following the 2018 by-election, and 20 warnings were issued to real estate agents following the 2020 general election, for completing ballot papers on behalf of voters, and that the persons in question were found to have misunderstood the electoral laws.
 - 1.2. Notes that parts of the electoral system unique to the City of Melbourne have not been comprehensively reviewed since the commencement of the City of Melbourne Act 2001 and, while no systemic or intentional ballot fraud has been found to date, reasserts that the real and perceived integrity of the electoral system is essential, both in its own right and in order to avoid mistrust in the democratic process and governments elected under that process.
 - 1.3. Notes the resolution of Melbourne City Council of 27 July 2021 (attachment 2), requesting of the Minister for Local Government that he "commence [a review of the City of Melbourne electoral system] in 2022 in order to ensure that reforms are able to be legislated by well in advance of the 2024 Council General elections."
 - 1,4. Urges the Local Government Minister to respond to this request.

1.2 Directs that the following statement be placed on the Council website:

Russia launched a large-scale invasion of Ukraine on 24 February 2022.

On 1 March 2022, the City of Melbourne determined that it would suspend its sister city relationship with St Petersburg, Russia, for an indefinite period.

The City of Melbourne stands with the people of Ukraine, the people of St Petersburg, and victims of war everywhere. We condemn the acts of violent aggression by the Russian Government.

All Council support for activities by civic, cultural and community organisations requiring cooperation with the government of St Petersburg, and all formal cooperation between the governments of the sister cities, is suspended.
