Crime Safety in Carlton

Cr Dr Ball, Health, Wellbeing and Belonging Portfolio Lead read out the following written public question submitted by Phillip Mansour:

There have been recent confirmed Lygon Street murders in Carlton, Crime is on the increase. Victoria police are short staffed and advise it's a systemic council problem.

We recently had another public stabbing on Lygon Street, which was televised on major television 6pm news.

What immediate action is the city of Melbourne taking to ensure the safety of the community is greatly improved, please share these documents?

What short term and long term plan of action is in place to ensure people feel safe in the streets of Carlton?

When are the safety cameras in Carlton being installed?

I'd hate to see another incident occur in Carlton.

We need to ensure every effort is made to make business owners, residents and visitors feel safe in Carlton, what is the precise strategy here?

Cr Dr Ball read out the following response as provided by Dean Robertson, Director City Safety, Security and Amenity:

Thank you for your question.

CoM is aware of the incident that took place in Lygon Street and that Victoria Police have an active investigation underway.

We are also aware Victoria Police will shortly be implementing a number of reassurance and targeted operations in the Lygon street area, which means there will be a broader Police presence.

CoM will also be participating in the Local Safety Committee for Melbourne West Police area, including Carlton, with the first meeting scheduled for the 24th of June 2022.

The expansion of Safety Cameras into Lygon Street and Argyle Square has not been included in the proposed 22/23 Budget process, however as consultation remains open, we will include your feedback in the consultation on the 22/23 budget process.

The Lord Mayor Sally Capp read out the following response as provided by Sally Naughton, Acting Director, City Property:

Thank you for your query.

I am pleased to advise you the City of Melbourne currently has 26 public toilets, of which 22 are genderneutral Exceloos. We also have 39 publicly accessible toilets (toilet blocks/rest rooms) in our parks (not including sports pavilions) and 28 of these are gender-neutral Exceloos.

All 6 of our City of Melbourne Libraries have male and female toilets and all branches have at least 1 accessible toilet that is 'signed' for both male and female use. The City of Melbourne is currently developing plans for a new library opposite the Queen Victoria Market, which will contain gender-neutral toilets. We are aiming for this to be operational at the end of 2023.

- 1. That the Future Melbourne Committee:
 - 1.1. Notes the update on implementation of the City of Melbourne Transport Program to Aid City Recovery and Reactivation (refer Attachment 3 of the report from management)
 - 1.2. Notes the findings of the Urbis study; Contribution of Different Modes of Transport to City Recovery (refer Attachment 4 of the report from management)
 - 1.3. Notes the design improvements recently completed or upcoming in response to community feedback (refer Attachment 5 of the report from management)
 - 1.4. Notes the further proposed changes to Exhibition Street to smooth traffic flow and provide access to adjacent businesses and destinations (refer Attachment 6 of the report from management)
 - 1.5. Notes the analysis of options to smooth traffic flow on Queens Bridge Street and management's intention to continue to investigate the option of a bus lane (refer Attachment 7 of the report from management)
 - 1.6. Endorses the deferral of further installation of new protected bike lanes in the Hoddle Grid during financial year 2022/2023 only, and that during this time design work will continue, including detailed design for Flinders Street
 - 1.7. Endorses prioritised delivery of protected bike lanes outside the Hoddle Grid to high value routes including Arden Street, Macaulay Road and Royal Parade during financial year 2022/2023, noting that Arden Street and Macaulay Road as 2021/22 projects will commence as soon as practicable.
 - 1.8. Notes that the two previous paragraphs will not result in any reduction in proposed budget for 2022/23, being \$4m on the Cycle Infrastructure program plus any funds carried forward from 2021/22.
 - 1.9. Notes the above endorsements will still allow the continued delivery of protected bike lanes per the Transport Strategy 2030, other than the State Government arterial road upgrades which will not be delivered at the current rate.
 - 1.10. Reiterates the ongoing commitment to ensuring that there are adequate and safe loading zones within the Hoddle Grid, and that the conversion of car parking bays to loading zones where there is a demonstrated need will continue.
 - 1.11. Notes that the installation of barriers between tram lanes and vehicular lanes, e.g. on Collins Street, has likely succeeded in changing driver behaviour but has also had an impact on traffic flows for all transport modes, and in order to understand these changes requests that management work with the Department of Transport to study and report on the impacts, to better inform future transport planning decisions by both levels of government.

 - 1.1. Requests that public consultation and completion of the 'Future Streets Framework' as described in the Transport Strategy 2030 be finalised and presented to this Committee for endorsement by March 2023.
 - 1.2. Requests that recommendations for the future staging of works to implement the 'Elizabeth Street Strategic Opportunities Plan' be presented to this Committee for consideration by March 2023.
 - 1.3. Requests that a report on the extent to which the objectives of the 'Little Streets transformations' project have succeeded, as well as any recommendations for improvements to the Little Streets treatments over time consistent with the 'Future Streets Framework', be presented to this Committee for consideration by March 2023.
 - 1.4. Requests that any recommendations from management necessary to ensure that the policy and consultation work mentioned above is adequately resourced in 2022-23 be presented to the Special Future Melbourne Committee meeting to be held on 23 June 2022.

9. Public questions

Deferral of protected bike lane roll out

Alexander Sheko asked for clarity surrounding the deferral of the installation of new protected bike lanes for the 2022/2023 financial year from a Councillor who voted in favour of the motion as part of Agenda item 6.9.

The Lord Mayor Sally Capp explained that pausing for 12 months gives an opportunity for people in the city to utilise and adjust to having the bike lanes in the Hoddle Grid. The pause also allows for design work on Flinders Street to proceed and recognising the permanency of the Exhibition Street bike lanes to proceed. It also allows for issues raised by business owners and delivery vehicle operators to be considered and any necessary adjustments to be made safely. It allows more time for discussion surrounding safety for bike riders as well. Going forward Council's approach is about listening and responding, continuous improvement; embedding and adjusting.
