






Shared Community Development Values

Neighbourhood Houses bring people together to connect, learn and contribute in their local community through social, educational, recreational and support activities, using a unique community development approach (Neighbourhood Houses Victoria).

Neighbourhood Houses work within a community development framework and are governed by a volunteer Committee of Management. This builds social connections and networks that are based on trust, respect and reciprocal interaction – known as social capital. The work of Neighbourhood Houses is guided by ten principles:

Neighbourhood Houses within the City of Melbourne are welcoming and inclusive places for people of all abilities and backgrounds. They are committed to building stronger and more resilient communities using a strength-based approach that empowers individuals to be self-determining and realise their potential.

Similarly, the City of Melbourne works across life stages and interests to support residents through a broad range of services, infrastructure and programing. It is committed to social inclusion; aiming to facilitate opportunities for all people to participate in the social, economic and civic life of the City, irrespective of ability, background, class, gender and orientation (Council Plan 2017-21).

A City for People

Aiming to maintain Melbourne as a "city for people", the City of Melbourne:

- welcomes people from all walks of life so they feel safe, and can participate fully in their community.
- supports people to have access to appropriate housing, education, healthy food, and spaces for recreation and community services.
- adapts to meet the needs of a growing, changing population.
- supports better life opportunities and outcomes for all, particularly the vulnerable.
